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ORDINANCE NO. 13

ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING AND RESTRICTING
SPEED ON THE TOWNSHIP ROADS OF BUFFALO TOWN-
SHIP, BUTLER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AND
PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers granted by the Second Class Township Code, including sub-sections XXIV, XLI, and XLVII of Section 702 and Section 1103 of Article 11 of the Vehicle Code of 1929 (Act 403) as supplemented and amended, the Board of Supervisors of Buffalo Township, Butler County, Pennsylvania, hereby enact and ordain as follows:

1. This Ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the Buffalo Township Traffic Control Ordinance.
2. The words and phrases used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in Section 102 of the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as supplemented and amended.
3. From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, no one shall park any vehicle on any public road of the Township or highway unless there is fifteen (15) feet of the traveled and/or improved portion of said highway left open for vehicular travel.
4. Any person who shall violate any provision of Section 3 hereof pertaining to parking, upon conviction before any Justice of the Peace or Alderman in the County of Butler, may be sentenced to pay a fine of Three (\$3.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution for the first offense and in default of payment thereof shall be sentenced and committed to the County Prison

for a term not exceeding three days and for the second offense within one year's time, a fine of Five (\$5.00) Dollars with costs of prosecution and in default of payment shall be sentenced and committed to the County Prison for a term not exceeding five (5) days.

5. If any section, provision, or part of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional such unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, provisions or parts hereof.

The Board of Supervisors hereby declares it would have enacted and ordained the remaining sections, provisions or parts of this Ordinance if it had known such sections, provisions or parts to be held unconstitutional.

ORDAINED AND ENACTED INTO LAW by the Board of Supervisors of Buffalo Township this 6th day of March, 1962, to be effective in ten days from the date hereof.

AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 13

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 13 was enacted by the powers granted by the Vehicle Code of 1929, now repealed, and

WHEREAS, the Township of Buffalo requires for the health and safety of the traveling public on the roads of the Township adequate passage.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, as follows:

1. Unless otherwise posted, no motor vehicle as defined by the Vehicle Code shall be parked, stopped, standing, or unattended or attended, upon any public road of the Township, unless there is an unobstructed width to allow the passage of motor vehicles in both directions upon the roadway and unless there is two (2) feet distance from the edge of the traveled roadway to the vehicle.

2. The owner and/or operator of the motor vehicle guilty of violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a summary offense, and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars.

3. Posting shall mean for this ordinance, the erection of a sign by the authority of the Township Supervisors which will give public notice of permission to park, said permission to

be given where such parking would not interfere with the passage of traffic upon the road.
